To all Brother Knights:

125TH SUPREME CONVENTION

I wish to first extend my sincere gratitude to all delegates attending the 125th Supreme Convention. I hope that everyone felt it was an "Experience of a Lifetime". I know I did. It's hard to appreciate the magnitude of the opening Mass unless you have attended one. Cardinal Bertone, the Vatican Secretary of State, along with eight other Cardinals, presided over 90 Archbishops and Bishops, and over 100 Priests from 10 different countries. It was a pleasure to have all three Nebraska Bishops and Reverend Steve Major of Beatrice present. Truly, an experience that I feel all Knights of Columbus members should have sometime in their lives. I urge all brother Knights to run for one of the seven elected delegates at the next convention to be held in Quebec. Remember, only those with current passports will be able to travel to Canada. Therefore, if you are planning to run for a position as a delegate representing the State of Nebraska, you will need to apply for a passport very soon if you don't already have one. It is taking 4-5 months for processing a new passport. Plan well in advance of the August 2008 Supreme Convention.

MARIAN HOUR OF PRAYER

We again will host a Marian Hour of Prayer. Two icons will be traveling the state from September through May. I ask that each council host their own Marian Hour of Prayer when the icon is in your district. It is a most beautiful icon, and all State Deputies throughout the world are planning to present Pope Benedict XVI a bouquet of prayers when finished, via our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. Each urban council will be scheduled for two days and each rural council will be scheduled for three days — one day for the prayer service and either one or two for traveling. I realize the schedule is tight and greatly appreciate your efforts in meeting your district's schedule.

FIRST STATE DEPUTY HONORED

The first Grand Knight of Fr. Flanagan of Boys Town Council 652, Omaha, and the first Nebraska State Deputy (1902-1903) was Timothy J. Mahoney. He passed away in 1917 and was buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Omaha. We believe that he never had a personal grave marker, but was buried at the base of the Mahoney family marker.

Last Fall, Council 652 designed a marker for T.J. Mahoney and submitted this idea to the State Council. The idea was well received, and a marker was purchased.

On Memorial Day, May 28, 2007, after the annual Knights of Columbus Mass at the cemetery, a small group gathered around the new Mahoney marker. During a brief ceremony, State and Council 652 Chaplain Father Michael Gutsell, said prayers and blessed the marker. Following this, State Secretary Mike Conrad and State Treasurer Jim Haiar said a few words. Also in attendance were several members of Council 652 and Fourth Degree Knights, who gave official recognition by saluting the site.

PLANNING MEANS A SUCCESSFUL COUNCIL PROGRAM

Family picnic, recruiting, pancake breakfast, wives' dinner, Buck-a-Month, vocations fair, church cleaning, roadside cleanup, soccer challenge, initiations, One Rose – One Life, and Tootsie Rolls. Wow, so many things to do! How do you start? Where do you find time to fit everything in? How can you get all this done?

You can't! But your council can. It takes the efforts of all council members to have a successful program. As the old saying goes "... many hands make light work...".

Planning is probably one of the most important things that your council can do to insure its success. By setting up a calendar, you can establish goals, develop manpower needs, and plan for success.

There are many tools out there that can help you in this planning process. Some of them cost hundreds of dollars and provide you with great reports and colorful charts. However, you can do the job just as well and get the same results by simply using a calendar.

Once the council has elected its officers and chosen its directors and chairmen, set up a planning meeting. If there are certain things that the council does every year, put them on the calendar first. Once that is done open the floor up to new ideas. Talk about each of them and decide if it is something that you want to try. Don't be afraid to try something new and different. Figure out a date and time for the activity and put it on the calendar. As you put each activity on the calendar, assign a chairman to head up the project. If you have not done so already, establish your Power of Ten groups and use these resources to staff your projects.

Once these assignments are done, and your calendar has been set, let everyone know what you are doing. Publish your calendar in your council newsletter and parish bulletin.

A strong and active council makes it that much easier to recruit new members. When they see all the great things that you do and realize there is something for the entire family, it will be much easier for them to say "yes" when you ask them to be a part of your family.

Don't forget to send in your "Report of Officers" and "Report of Directors and Chairmen" so that each of these individuals begin to receive valuable and useful information about their area from Supreme. Also take a few minutes to fill out the *Log Book* forms that indicate your officers and directors as well as your meeting and activity calendars for the upcoming year.

Our State Deputy's motto is "E Pluribus Unum Pro Deo", "One from many before God." Together much can be accomplished. As we grow, the job becomes even easier.

Take Action ... Just Ask... Make your BLITZ a Success!

One of the important action items in your council's membership growth plan for the fraternal year is a Membership Blitz this fall. For councils planning to do a Blitz, October is a great time to kick things off with an all out effort to maximize the effectiveness of your membership team's efforts by canvassing your parish on one weekend, and initiate new members two weeks later.

Here are a few tips to help make your Membership Blitz a membership success:

- Get your pastor's approval to conduct a Blitz membership drive. Agree on a weekend (preferably October 6-7), what is to be done, and by whom. *Plan, plan, plan.*
- Order plenty of Supreme flyers. A *Blitz Materials Order Form* is available at www.kofc.org/cmf/resources/BlitzFormNew.pdf. Allow four to six weeks for delivery.
- Place a membership drive notice in your parish bulletin at least two weeks in advance of the actual weekend drive.
- Inform your insurance rep. about the dates of this effort.
- Have council brochures and other materials for handouts. Also include a prospect card in each handout packet or place in the church pews.
- Have a pulpit announcement prepared and have a good presenter assigned to address the parishioners after every Mass during the assigned weekend.
- Have plenty of members available at all entries to the Church during every Mass. Inform them of proper dress and instruct them on their duties and expectations.

- After all weekend Masses, collect prospect cards. Meet with the membership committee on Sunday evening or as early as possible to assign teams to prospects.
- Set your First Degree within two weeks of the Blitz weekend.
- Get as many new recruits as possible to a First Degree. Schedule a second First Degree if needed.
- Explain the new member interest survey, new member insurance plan, Shining Armor Award program, dates of a Second and Third Degree, and all other relevant information to the new member.
- Immediately following the Blitz drive, complete a Blitz report and forward it to your District Deputy.

In addition, you may want to consider an information night as part of your Blitz efforts, inviting prospective members and their families to a special event that enables you to spend more time sharing information with them about this great fraternal ministry. Planning a Corporate Communion for one of the Masses during the Blitz weekend can also be effective in communicating to the parish the unity of our membership. And keep in mind that when it comes to bringing new members into the Knights of Columbus, two simple words are very powerful: . . .

Just Ask!

He is the owner of Red D Plumbing, is a Certified Master Plumber, and willing to donate his time and services to Project IXIM. As a self-employed father of six, taking time off of work meant sacrifice.

Project IXIM (www.ixim.org) is a ministry of the Archdiocese of Omaha and the Diocese of Huehuetenango, Guatemala. Through this ministry, members (lay and religious) of the Omaha Archdiocese travel to remote regions of Guatemala to help the poor by ministering to their spiritual, medical, and other needs. You may have heard about Project IXIM recently on KVSS or in your church bulletin.

In addition to the medical needs facing the residents of Huehuetenango, one of their major needs is improving their water supply. In this mountainous region of the Central American rain forest, there is little fresh water. What water there is has been infested with mosquito larvae and other parasites. Thus, it is imperative that a clean and safe drinking water supply be established for the families that live here.
